

**Zimbabwe African National Union
Patriotic Front (ZANU PF)**

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BRIEF STATEMENT BY THE ZANU PF SECRETARY FOR INFORMATION AND PUBLICITY CDR AMBASSADOR L. M. MUYO ON THE OUTCOME OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE SPECIAL SESSION HELD AT THE PARTY HEADQUARTERS IN HARARE ON THE 1ST NOVEMBER 2007.

The ZANU PF Central Committee met in special Session at the Party Headquarters in Harare on the 1st November 2007 in terms of Article 7 Section 3(7) of the Party's Constitution. The meeting having been duly convened, noted the impossibility of the top leadership of the Party to remember their duties imposed by the Party's Constitution in particular, on amendment under Article 7 Section 3B thereof, re-emphasized upon which, Cde Obert Makoni was unanimously elected to preside over the proceedings considering he was the most senior member of the Party present.

After considering the recommendations from various Provinces, the following was resolved:

- 10. Having commenced with Tsvi (One Hundred and One) of the 300 (Three Hundred) ZANU PF Central Committee members the Session was declared fully Constituted.
- 20. The Central Committee on behalf of ZANU PF, expressed profound gratitude to the Zimbabwe Defence Force (DDF) for their intervention efforts in the internal affairs of the Party as the governing PARTY with the aim of bringing normalcy back within the Party and Government.

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- 3.0 The Central Committee further visited the Sublety Member conducted on the 10th November 2007 and congratulated the Party members for their unflinching support of the intervention efforts by the Zimbabwe Defence Forces towards bringing normalcy in both the Party and Government.
- 4.0 The unconstitutional removal of Cde Erickson Dambudzo Mwaambiye as the Vice President and Second Secretary of ZANU PF, and its implication for the Party was nullified bothways and he was restored to being a member Central Committee member.
- 5.0 The reconstituted seven Provincial Coordinating Committees (PCC) comprising and expelling members from the Party were nullified and the PCCs directed that the PCCs convene members for a general and expelling be heard by the National Disciplinary Committee (NDC) were withdrawn.
- 6.0 All members of the Central Committee elected at the 2004 Congress and were subsequently suspended or expelled from the Party subsequent to Congress on the basis of National Unilateral Declaration by the G-80 cabinet were reinstated.
- 7.0 Members from the Provincial Councils and subordinate organs of the Party who were suspended or expelled from the Party subsequent to the 2004 Congress were reinstated.
- 8.0 The following members of the G-80 Cabinet be expelled from the Party:

5.0 Cde R.G. Mafema was removed from the position of President and First Secretary of ZANU PF by unanimous vote.

5.0 Cde R.G. Mafema should resign forthwith from the position of Head of State of Zimbabwe, and in the event that the resignation will not have been tendered by midday 20th November 2017, the ZANU PF Chief Whip was ordered to initiate proceedings for the removal of the President in terms of Section 87 of the Constitution of Zimbabwe Amendment (No 20).

5.0 Cde Phileas Mphahlele was removed from the position of Vice President and Second Secretary of ZANU PF for being abusive, a member of the cabinet, promoting interests, promoting hate speech and behaving in a manner inconsistent with the office and decorum of the office of Vice President.

5.0 Cde Grace Mugabe was removed from the position of Secretary for the Women's League of ZANU PF for promoting hate speech, divisions, and causing rifts and power not delegated to her office.

5.0 Cde E.D. Mungweni was elected as President and First Secretary of ZANU PF pending ratification by the Extraordinary Congress scheduled for the 10th - 12th December 2017 and was nominated as the Party Presidential Candidate for the 2018 General Elections.

5.0 Cde E.D. Mungweni was nominated to fill in the vacancy of State President in terms of Part 4 Paragraph 140 of the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution of Zimbabwe Amendment (No 20).

5.0 The Central Committee acknowledged the need to discharge its functions as the Supreme Organ of the Party outside Congress in terms of Section 55 under Article 7 of the Party Constitution and the Platform was directed

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to revert back to its subordinate position as the Secretariat of the Central Committee.

5.0 The principle of One Centre of Power should be removed from the Party's Constitution.

5.0 The Party Constitution should be amended to reduce the Cabinet Coordinating Committee as an Organ of the Party.

5.0 The Party should place Vice Presidents in strategic positions within the Party and Government as the best of merit.

5.0 The Central Committee acknowledged the sterling role and assistance proffered by the Frontline States in particular Botswana, Zambia, Tanzania and Angola. In ZANU PF towards the attainment of independence in Zimbabwe.

5.0 The Extraordinary Congress scheduled for the 10-12 December 2017 go ahead primarily, satisfying the decisions of the Central Committee in portfolio.

04. Rectifying the appointment of Cde E.D. Mungweni as the President and First Secretary of ZANU PF.

05. Rectifying the removal of Cde R.G. Mugabe as the President and First Secretary of ZANU PF.
